

Business Coordinator Report BOE Meeting September 25, 2024

2023.2024 Budget

The revised 23-24 Budget vs Actual reflects the transfers approved at the August BOE meeting including the transfer of the year end surplus in the amount of \$6821.46 to the new BoE Non-lapsing Account.

2024.2025 Budget

As of August 31, 2024 the district spent 10.23% of our annual budget. We anticipate fully funding our expenses for the year.

Title I Grant

CSDE has notified us that Hampton is not eligible for a FY25 Title I Grant. The FY24 Title I funding of \$16,385 is being used during the 24-25 year with \$15,234 offsetting the cost of our intervention teacher and \$1,151 supporting our homeless students. These funds will not be available to support our 25-26 budget.

US Department of Education uses the US Census Bureau's Small Area Income and Poverty **Estimates** (SAIPE) <u>SAIPE (census.gov)</u> to calculate Title I funding. In order to be eligible for the FY25 funding the 2022 SAIPE must indicate the district had an estimated 10 or more eligible children and the number of these children must have exceeded 2% of the districts total population. Eligible children are aged 5 to 17 who are living in a household with an income below the poverty line, participate in Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF), are neglected and delinquent children, those living in state run institutions, or children in foster care.
